## Father Turney

Reverend William Charles Turney, who died in Winnipeg on Saturday at the age of 77, had the admiration and respect not only of the parishioners he served with devotion during his 30 years in the city but of thousands of people who knew him only as a name in the newspapers.

This admiration and respect for Father Turney arose from the fact that he was courageous enough to say out what many people loud thought privately. Father Turney was convinced that some of the city's traffic laws, as they applied to pedestrians, were wrong and unfair. He had the courage of his convictions. He defied these laws, not surreptitiously, as many people did and do but openly and publicly. And he said that he intended to go on defying them.

While one should not condone deliberate lawbreaking, individual dissent is all too rare in a world becoming more and more regimented. For his fearlessness, as for his many years of unselfish and faithful service, Father Turney will long be remembered with admiration and affection.
